Expectations

This is a 12th grade level class on the level of an Honors class. I expect that you will need to spend **90 minutes per day** on this course. **If you are not a fast reader, you may need to spend more time on this class.** It is imperative that students keep up with course work. It will be very difficult to catch up if you fall behind.

-This is a Biblical worldview class. Therefore, the Bible will be central to our learning. Each student should ensure that he or she brings a Bible to class. The version of the Bible should be one that the student clearly understands. I recommend the ESV or NASB since they are word for word translations.

-Student presentations will be assigned at various times throughout the year. It is expected that those presentations will reflect thoughtful preparation for effective instruction and shared learning.

-Course work assignments are to be turned in on time, complete, and well done, in hard copy, and handed into the tutor. Late or incomplete work will be penalized.

-Essays are to be typed, double spaced in 12 point in Times New Roman. You are expected to follow the same formatting standards as used in your PEP Core F composition class. Essays will be graded for spelling, grammar and stylistic errors in addition to content. While this is not a composition class, we want to reinforce the disciplines taught in the other Core F classes.

-Class discussions are a core element to WT3. Every student will be expected to participate in class discussion. Students will be expected to maintain decorum in all interactions with the tutor and other students. The goal of this course will not be debate but rather polite discourse for the purpose of learning.

<u>Goals</u>

Students will:

- -Discuss Biblical worldview issues and examine the worldviews presented in each written work.
- -Analyze written texts based on their views of God, origins, man, ethics, evil, death, and the meaning of history.
- -Compare and contrast the analysis described above with the Biblical revelation on these issues.
- -Be able to communicate this information in verbal and written form.
- -Be able to articulate their personal worldview.
